1		MR. VANCE: We call Kenneth
2		Young.
3		KENNETH YOUNG, called as a witness
4		on behalf of the Defendant, having been duly sworn,
5		testified as follows:
6		DIRECT EXAMINATION
7	QUE	STIONS BY MR. VANCE:
8	Q	Would you state your name for the record, please?
9	A	Kenneth Wayne Young.
10	Q	And how old are you, Kenneth?
11	A	I am 21.
12	Q	Kenneth, I am going to direct your attention back
13		to July 13, 1982.
14		Did you have an occasion to be at Koehne Park
15		in Waco, Texas on that day?
16	A	Yes, sir, I did.
17	Q	About what time did you arrive?
18	A	Around 7:00 or 7:30.
19	Ω	Okay, did you go to any particular spot in the
20		park, or did you travel it or
21	А	Well, I came down the first road that comes off
22		Lake Shore.
23	Q	All right.
24	A	And it comes down to, like, a paved type and then
25		it comes down a gravel.

1	Q	Okay, and did you stop at a particular place there?
2	A	Yes, where it stops the pavement stops right
3		there.
4	Q	Okay, I want you to come over here to what has been
5		marked and admitted as Defendant's Exhibit No. 2.
6		This being Lake Shore Drive and this is the
7		entrance to Koehne Park. Would you mind putting
8		your initials KY, where you were positioned?
9	A	Okay.
10	Q	Okay, thank you. Is there some type of facility
11		there like a picnic table or a bench or anything?
12	A	There is a bench, but we were leaning up against
13		our cars.
14	Q	Okay, who were you with?
15	A	John Henderson.
16	Q	Okay, and do you have an idea of what time you got
17		there?
18	A	Oh, around 7:00 or 7:30.
19	Q	Was there any particular reason to go out there?
20	A	We just meet friends down there.
21	Q	Okay. Now, the place that you were positioned, for
22		anybody coming up off the beach area, would they
23		be or is there any way to get to the other part
24		of the park without going by you?
25	А	No, sir.

	1	Q	And about how long were you out there?
i.	. 2	A	Probably from around 7:00 7:30 until about twilight.
	3	Q	Okay, what time would you consider twilight?
	4	A	Probably about 8:30 to 9:00.
	5	Q	Did you ever see an orange Pinto with a boy and two
	6		girls come up out of that beach area?
	7	A	Not out of the beach area.
	8	Q	Not out of the beach area?
	9	A	No, sir.
	10	Q	Did you ever see some people in an orange Pinto
	11		and a gold Pontiac stop in that at the end of
	12		that paved area and have a conversation?
	13	A	No, sir.
	14	Q	If that had happened, would you have been in a
	15		position to notice it?
	16	A	I would have if I hadn't had my back turned.
	17	Q	Was your back turned during most of the time?
	18	A	I can't remember that far back.
	19	Q	Did you, in fact, ever see an orange Pinto enter
. ,	20		Koehne Park in the evening of July 13, 1982?
	21	A	Yes, sir, I did.
	22	Q	Okay, and would you describe or point out on
	23		Defendant's Exhibit 2 where you saw that orange
	24		Pinto proceed?

It came off of Lake Shore.

1	Q	All right, let us step over here and use this
2		pointer so all the jurors can see, okay, just stand
3		back so everybody can see.
4	A	It came off of Lake Shore, came down here and entered
5		the circle, and from there, I couldn't tell where
6		it went.
7	Q	Okay, did you ever see that orange Pinto exit Koehne
8		Park?
9	A	No, sir, I didn't.
10	Q	All right, did you know the individuals in the
11		orange Pinto at that time?
12	A	I knew Kenneth Franks. He was an acquaintance, but
13		we weren't really, you know, on speaking terms or
14		anything. I just seen him around.
15	Q	Did you see him in that car that evening?
16	A	Yes, sir, I did.
17	Q	Did he stop and talk to you or anything?
18	A	No, sir.
19	Q	During that evening, did you ever go down to the
20		circle area?
21	A	Yes, when we went to leave, we did.
22	Q	Okay, what did you notice when you went down to the
23	·	circle?
24	A	The white van and the Pinto but nobody around.
25	0	And do you remember what time that was?

1	A	About twilight, about 8:30 to 9:00.
2	Q	You all didn't stop in the circle, did you?
3	A	No, sir.
4		MR. VANCE: Okay, I have no
5		further questions.
6		CROSS EXAMINATION
7	QUES	STIONS BY MR. BUTLER:
8	Q	Did you see a yellow Granada leave, Mr. Young?
9	A	No, sir.
10	Q	A yellow Granada with four or five black folks in
11		it?
12	A	No, sir.
13	Q	Were you in a position that you would have been
14		able to see every vehicle that left that circle
15		area?
16	A	Yes, I was in a position, but I couldn't I wasn't
17		noticing every vehicle that left.
18	Q	And it wasn't full dark but twilight, as you call
19		it, when you left?
20	A	Yes, sir.
21	Q	Okay, we discussed this before, have we not,
22		Mr. Young?
23	A	Yes, sir.
24	Q	You were in a black Trans AM, weren't you?
25	A	Black Z28.

Yes, sir.

1	Ω	Z28. Mr. Young, do you know what the orange Pinto
2		did after you left the park?
3	A	No, sir, I don't.
4	Q	Is it possible that it could have driven back down
5		to that gravel area and then returned to the circle?
6	A	Yes, it is.
7	Q	Is it possible that a gold Pontiac or Chevrolet or
8		gold looking car could have followed them back after
9		you left?
10	A	Yes, sir.
11	Q	You don't know what happened?
12	A	I don't know what happened. That is possible.
13	Q	And you didn't even see every car that went by
14		because your back was turned on occasion?
15	A	Yes, sir.
16	Q	While you were there?
17	A	Yes, sir.
18	Q	And really, the only thing you can say you saw is
19		Kenneth Franks when they drove in?
20	A	Yes, sir.
21	Q	That you knew him well enough to know who he was?
22	A	Yes, sir.
23	Q	And that at the time you left which was before
24		dark, the orange car was parked there in the circle?
25	A	Yes, sir.

1		MR. BUTLER: Pass the witness,
. 2		Your Honor.
3		REDIRECT EXAMINATION
4	QUES	TIONS BY MR. VANCE:
5	Q	Mr. Young, you could also say that the orange Pinto
6		did not pass your position and go down to the beach
7		area, did it?
8	P.	Yes, sir.
9	Q	And that was between 7:00 and approximately 8:30 at
10		night?
11	A	Yes, sir.
12		MR. VANCE: Pass the witness.
13		MR. BUTLER: We don't have
14		anything further.
15		THE COURT: All right, may he
16		be finally excused? All right, Mr. Young, you are
17		finally excused.
18		(Witness excused.)
19		RICKY GUTHRIE, called as a witness
