At what point during that time did he Q. glance over toward the brunet 10 11 As he was saying that you've been fucking around with Α. 12 his old lady, like that, toward where the brunett was. 13 Q. Okay. Whose old lady? 14 He said his name again, that dude's, but --15 Q. Lucky's? 16 Α. Yes. 17 All right. What else did Spence say? Q. As he had him by the shirt there, the guy was like, 18 Α. 19 you know, shaking his head no. He said, "No, we're just friends." Spence said, "No, mother fucker, he 20 21 walked in and caught y'all fucking around --22 MR. McCALL: I'm going to 23 object to any hearsay, Your Honor. 24 Α. -- on the couch. 25

1 MR. McCALL: Could I have a 2 running objection on that? 3 THE COURT: Yes, sir. 4 QUESTIONING CONTINUED BY MR. FEAZELL: 5 So that you can get it all out, tell the jury what he Q. 6 said. 7 He said, "No, mother fucker, he walked in on y'all and Α. caught you fucking around sitting on the couch," or something like that. I thought he said on the couch, 9 10 or something. 11 Q. Then what happened? 12 Α. Spence had him by the shirt and, well, Spence was 13 hollering at him, by then pretty loud, and he said --14 started calling him names. He said, "You fucking punk," and hit him up beside the head. 15 16 Q. How hard? He hit him pretty hard up beside the head, and then 17 Α. grabbed the boy by the throat and he pulled his knife 18 19 out -- or he had his knife out -- I don't remember if he pulled it out. I seen a knife in his hand, and he had 20 the boy by the throat. They were a little ways from 21 22 the car and he yanked him up and pulled him up, and he was like sticking the boy with his knife because 23 he was trying to make him -- like he was trying to 24 make a noise or something, but he had him by the throat, 25

that the front end was at an angle.

- Q. What did you do when you saw it?
- A. I was just looking over there -- I was just looking around because he was talking kind of loud, and wondering if anybody was hearing. That is, it happened so fast, it didn't take as long as it does for me to sit here and say it. It just happened real fast. When he backed him up to the car, he had a hold of him and back him up to the car and just started stabbing him several times, and the boy fell down.
- Q. Did Spence -- tell the jury whether or not Spence was saying anything to Kenneth while he was sticking him with those little sticks.

 - Q. Spence was telling you where to turn?

How did you divide it? 13 I flipped through it when I stopped to let Tony off, Α. and I just kind of run through it real quick and put 14 it in three sections. I split it three ways. 15 16 I gave him about \$150, or close to it, and I had a little less than that when I looked through it. 17 18 Now, after the murder, immediately after -- I'm Q. talking about before the next morning as you were 19 20 dropping off Spence and Tony, what were your immediate plans at that time? 21 I was thinking of gathering all my belongings and 22 Α. leaving town. 23 Q. Okay. 24 Because of the murders?

1 Why didn't you do that, Mr. Melendez? Q. 2 Well, when I let David off, we had talked for a minute Α. and I told him I was going to to do that, and he said 3 something about for me to wait a couple of days, he 4 was supposed to get some money from that dude and we 5 6 would leave town together. He would get the money and 7 we would have some money to take with us. 8 Q. Okay. Did he say which dude? He said that guy. He was talking about the guy at the Α. 9 10 store. 11 Q. Did he say how much money? Yes sir. He had said around \$5,000. 12 Α. 13 Q. All right. While y'all were riding around drinking beer before you went to Koehne Park and saw these 14 three teenagers, did David have any money with him 15 then that you know of? 16 17 I don't think he had too much money with him because we Α. stopped every few stores and Tony had bought the beer, 18 19 and I -- Tony and I had paid for the beer that we bought. 20 21 Q. Anything else that gives you an indication Spence didn't have any money? 22 23 He may have said he didn't have much money, or tried Α. 24 to pitch in one time, but didn't have enough, so Tony

and I took care of the -- we paid for it.

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1 and I asked him about the car, when did he get his car, 2 and he said he had just gotten it, and I asked him if 3 he had gotten any money from that guy to get his car, and he said no, he hadn't gotten any money but he had 4 5 been by there a couple of times. 6 Q. Okay. Then what? Well, we were -- I got a couple of beers at the store Α. 7 and we drank those and we were riding around and we 8 were running out of beer, so he said, "Let's stop and 9 get some more beer." We were over in that area 10 11 where he lives -- and he said, "Let's go up to the 12 store up here on Herring." 13 Which store is that? Q. 14 Α. The Rainbow Drive-Inn. 15 Q. Mr. Deeb's store? Α. Yes, sir. 16 17 Q. Did you go to that store? Yes, sir. He said, "Let's stop here and get some Α. 18 beer," and we pulled over and stopped. I said okay, and 19 20 he said, "Let's go in and I'll ask him about the money." 21 All right. Did you know who he was talking about? Q. 22 Yes, sir. Α. 23 Q. Okay. Who was he talking about?

He was talking about Deeb.

All right. What did you do?

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Α.

Q.

- 1 We stopped and we went inside the store. . A . Deeb was 2 there and there was somebody else there working at the 3 counter, listening to the radio, and we walked in and 4 Spence said something to Deeb. He kind of walked to 5 the end of the counter as we walked in, and Deeb said, "What are y'all up to?" or something like that. 6 7 Okay. Slow down and speak up for the Jury. What did Q. 8 Deeb say?
 - Spence said something to him like what's going on, or Α. something like that, and Deeb said, "What are y'all up to?"
 - Q. All right. Then what?
 - We walked toward the end of the counter there and Α. Spence said we were riding around drinking some beer, or something, and he said, "You remember Gilbert, don't you?" and Deeb nodded and said yeah. I spoke to him and said, "What are you up to?" or something like that, and Spence said, "Yeah, I just run into him. been riding around drinking a couple of beers and he asked me if I had gotten any money from you, and I told him --"
 - Okay, now wait a minute. Who is talking to who? Q.
- Spence is talking to Deeb. Α. 23
- 24 Q. About you?
- 25 Yes, sir. He said he had just run into me. Α.

FEAZELL: 13 Tell the Jury whether or not at that time you had any Q. 14 15 prospects of getting money from Deeb? 16 Α. Yes, sir. 17 Okay. What happened next? Spence said -- Spence told Deeb, he said -- after he 18 19 had said it was the end of the month and he was good for it, he said, "Well, Gilbert just got out of jail 20 21 and we're kind of low on money, and you know how it is." Had you just gotten out of jail? Q. 22 23 Α. Yes, sir. What had you been in jail for? Q. 24 25 I stayed in jail overnight. I think it was a misdemeanor Α.

- shoplifting charge. I think it was a package of 1 cigarettes, or something like that. 2 3 Q. Okay. After David told Deeb that, then what? Well, we were standing toward the end of the counter Α. 4 5 and he said, "Why don't we just ride around and drink some beer. We're almost out," and he walked to the 6 7 beer deal and got some, and he said, "We'll go drink this beer," and we started to walk toward the end of the 8 counter and he walked to the other side, and he said, 9 "I'll pay for this later when I get paid." 10 11 Okay. Now, who said that? Q.
- 12 Α. Spence.
- Said it to who? Q. 13
- 14 Α. He said it to Deeb.
- All right. Q. 15

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- And so we started walking toward the end of the counter Α. where the cash register is, and he said, "I'll pay for this later when I get paid," and he nooded at him and said okay and we said, "We'll see you later.
- Q. Who nodded and said okay?
- Α. Deeb.
- All right. At that time when David made the remark Q. 22 23 about getting paid, do you know whether or not David 24 was working anywhere?
 - I don't think he was working anywhere. Α.

1 What leads you to that conclusion? Q. 2 He had teed me off. I had asked him, you know, if Α. that guy had given him any money because I didn't think 3 he could get much on trading his car, and I asked him 4 about that. I don't remember what he said. He didn't 5 6 get very much for it. He hadn't been working. just said --7 8 Okay, I can't hear you. Q. He said he hadn't been working. 9 Α. 10 Q. Okay. What happened next? 11 We left. We got in the car and started to leave and Α. 12 I told Spence, I said, "That mother fucker aint going 13 to pay any money," and Spence said, "Yeah, he is. He's got plenty of money. He' just -- " I said, 14 15 "Well, if he's got money, why doesn't he go get it?" and he said just to wait until the end of the month 16 17 until he paid some bills from the store. 18 All right. Now, what was your understanding, Q. 19 Mr. Melendez, of the reason that you were going to get money from Deeb? 20 21 MR. McCALL: I object to the 22 speculation, Your Honor. It is calling for a conclusion 23 on the part of the witness. 24 THE COURT: Sustained. 25 QUESTIONING CONTINUED BY MR. FEAZELL:

1 Q. From everything that you had seen and observed and 2 heard during that conversation and other conversations between you and David, and between you and David and 3 4 Mr. Deeb, what were you going to be getting the money 5 for? 6 MR. McCALL: I will make the same objection, Your Honor. It calls for a conclusion, 7 speculation, and it is based on hearsay in part also. 8 9 THE COURT: Overruled. 10 QUESTIONING CONTINUED BY MR. FEAZELL: 11 I thought that he was talking about getting money from Α. 12 him telling me about the dude getting ripped off for the drugs, and he was paying the money to get his 13 14 drugs or money back to scare the people, and that's 15 what I thought the money was for. Okay. Which people are you talking about? 16 Q. 17 The three people that were killed by the lake. Α. All right. What happened after you and David had that 18 Q. conversation in the car? 19 He -- well, after I had told him why didn't he go get 20 Α. it and he said something about the end of the month, he 21 said, "He's going to pay us. He's going to get the 22 23 money. He's not going to fuck us around. better."

Q. Okay.

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1 Because we had gone in there and asked him about it Α. 2 and everything, and everything that had happened. 3 All right. Q. Then what? We were riding around and we drank some more, and I 4 asked him had he got rid of all of his stuff. " I was 5 talking about the things he had picked up out there 6 that the three kids had on them when we left and he 7 8 put in the trunk, and he said, "Yeah, I burned it." 9 Q. Okay. What happened next? We talked about a few more things. 10 Α. I said something about a pocket knife that I had had, that I had handed 11 to Tony that I had out there, when we were out there, 12 13 and I said, "I don't know where my knife is, the one I had at the lake. I think I lost it somewhere," and 14 he didn't say anything about it, and I said, "Well, I 15 16 think I may have lost it at the park," or something 17 like that. Did you and David talk about it any more during that Q. 18 time, about the killings or anything? 19 20 Α. No, sir. I said, "Well, I think I lost it," and then I said, "Well, I don't know anything about what happened 21 22 out there any way," and he said, "Yeah, I don't either," and we didn't talk about it any more. 23 24 Q. Gilbert, at the time of the murders, during the

summer of '82, did you look like how you look now?

- A. No, sir.
- 2 | Q. How did you look back then?
- A. I had fairly long hair, past my shoulders, and a mustache, and sort of a goatee.
- 5 Q. Okay. Anything else different about you?
- 6 | A. No, sir.
- 7 Q. Tell the Jury, Gilbert, whether you have got a criminal record or not?
- 9 A. Yes, sir, I do.
- 10 Q. What kind of things have you been convicted for?
- 11 A. I was convicted on attempted murder charge in 1973.
- 12 | Q. Where was that?
- 13 A. In Waco.
- 14 | Q. All right. What else?
- 15 A. I was convicted on -- I pleaded to that first charge
 16 and I pleaded guilty to Aggravated Sexual Abuse in
 17 1982.
- Q. All right. Who was you -- did you have-- tell the
 Jury whether or not you had a co-defendant on that
 charge.
 - A. Yes, sir, I did have a co-defendant.
- 22 Q. Who was your co-defendant?
- 23 A. David Spence.
- Q. All right. Tell the Jury whether or not you pled guilty to that case.

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- A. Yes, sir, I pled guilty to that case.
- Q. Okay. What year was that?
- 3 A. 1982.
- 4 Q. '82.
- 5 A. Yes, sir.
- 6 Q. Do you remember who the D.A. was in Waco in 1982?
- 7 A. I believe it was Felipe Reyna.
- 8 | Q. Okay. Anything else you have been convicted of?
- 9 A. Yes, sir. I pleaded guilty to two murders in 1985.
- 10 | Q. All right. Are they for two of the kids at the lake?
- 11 | A. Yes, sir.
- 12 Q. All right. What about is there another murder charge?
- 13 A. Yes, sir. I still have one capital murder charge pending against me.
- 15 | Q. Okay. Anything else?
- 16 A. No, sir.
- 17 | Q. Why are you testifying here today and yesterday?
- 18 A. Well there is several reasons.
- 19 Q. What are they?
 - A. Well, I really -- in view of all the things that have happened -- this has been going on for quite a while; two years, I believe, and a lot of things have happened since then, and I did think that I would have a really
- good chance of being found guilty had I went to
- 25 trial. I have -- I'm pretty tired of all this. It has

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been a long time and been pretty much of a strain, and I would like to get it over with, and I was guilty, so I went ahead and pleaded guilty to it and try to get it over with as far as my part.

- That's why you pleaded guilty. Tell the Jury why you Q. testified.
- A. There is several reasons for that, too.
- Tell them one at a time. Q.
- I am testifying because I -- well, I wanted to Α. Okay. get it over with, and I just think it was bad what happened out there, and maybe this is one way that I can kind of make up for it. I have thought a lot about it and I've had plenty of time to think about it, and it will make it a little easier for me living with it. I don't like talking about it, but if I get it out in the open and talk about it and get it off my shoulders, maybe it will be a little easier to live with. Also, I wanted to talk about it and let people know how I got involved in it and what my part was. I feel I was more or less brought into it -- I didn't really know what was going on or what was going to happen. intentionally go out there to do anything. I just happened to be walking home from work that day when I ran into David and Tony.
- Q. Any other reasons?

- 1 I just thought -- also to avoid the death sentence. Α. 2 It was because of the death penalty -- if I had gotten convicted, I probably would have gotten it, but I 3 4 didn't think that I deserved to die for the way it happened and the way I got involved in it, and the 5 way I was brought into it, I just figured that I 6 didn't really know what was happening, but I didn't 7 think that I deserved to die for the way I got involved 8 in it, my part of it. 9
- 10 All right. Anything else? Q.
 - There were several more reasons, Mr. Feazell, but I Α. just can't think of them all right at this minute.
 - Okay. When were you arrested on this case, if you Q. remember?
 - Α. I was indicted in November of '83.
- All right. Where were you at the time you were indicted? 16 Q.
 - I had - I was back in the McLennan County Jail, I Α. believe.
- 19 What were you in jail for?
- I was in jail -- I was serving prison time for the 20 Α. sexual abuse case. 21
 - Okay. Have you talked to any law enforcement officers Q. after you were indicted?
 - Α. Yes, sir. I think I talked to law enforcement officers a few times.

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- 1 How about before you were indicted on this case? Q. Did 2 you talk to them about this case? 3 Yes, I did at times. Α. Do you remember approximately when was the first time 4 Q. you talked to a law enforcement officer about this 5 6 case? The first time, I may have been asked a couple of Α. 7 questions about it. When I returned to Waco in March 8 of '82, I was bench warranted back to testify at 9 David Spence's sexual abuse trial. 10 11 In March of what? Q. In March of '83. 12 Α. 13 Okay. Do you remember who talked to you about it Q. 83. 14 then? Well, I didn't really talk about it. I was called out-15 Α. I talked to Truman Simons. I had never talked to him 16 17 I had just met him and he just kind of was asking me if I knew anything about it. I didn't talk 18 19 to him but about a couple of minutes and he asked me a couple of questions about it, if I knew anything, 20 and I told him that I didn't and it was just four or 21 22 five minutes. 23
 - Q. Okay. You said you had been bench warranted back to testify in Spence's trial, the sex abuse trial.
 - A. Yes, sir.

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1 Q. Did you testify? 2 No, I didn't. Α. 3 Who was it that benched you back; do you know? Was it Q. the prosecution or the defense? 4 5 It was David Spence's lawyer. Α. 6 When you were asked the first time about this case by 0. Truman Simons, did you tell him anything about it? 7 8 I told him I didn't know anything about it. A. Did you later -- tell the Jury whether or not you later Q. 10 gave a statement. Yes, sir, later I did give a statement. 11 Α. 12 Okay. What kind of statement was it that you gave the Q. 13 first time? 14 The first time I gave an oral statement. It was taped Α. statement. 15 16 Okay. Tape recorded? Q. Α. Yes, sir. 17 18 Q. Do you remember about when that was? 19 That was right at the time I came back. Α. 20 mistaken on the time I first talked to Truman Simons. 21 It was right in there. I may be wrong about that date, but I'm sure that the day I gave the oral statement 22 23 on the tape I had talked to Truman Simons.

25 Q. Do you know whether later that oral statement was

It was around that time.

the same day. I'm not sure.

1 later transcribed and typed? 2 Yes, sir, it was. Α. 3 Did you sign it? 0. Α. Yes, I did. 5 Okay. During that first statement, the oral statement, Q. 6 tell the Jury whether or not you made any reference to the defendant in this case, Mr. Deeb. 7 8 Yes, sir, I did. . A. Do you recall what you said about him? 9 Q. I don't remember exactly what I said. I remember 10 Α. something said about Spence had said that Deeb had 11 offered him \$5,000, or around \$5,000, to try to get 12 his money or his drugs back. 13 Q. After that tape was transcribed and you signed 14 it, were you then questioned about the contents of the 15 16 statement? 17 Α. Yes, sir. Do you recall whether or not you were questioned about Q. 18 19 Mr. Deeb? 20 Α. Yes, I was. At the time that you were questioned subsequently, later 21 Q. 22 questioned about Mr. Deeb, did you tell the law 23 enforcement people anything about him then? I was questioned about what I had said on the tape 24 Α. and everything, and I was asked about the law enforce-25

ment officer asking was I sure that I had told him everything and that was I sure that what I had told them about Deeb was correct, or was I just saying that.

Q. Uh huh.

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- At that time, when he asked me that question, of course, Α. I had already said that on the tape, I thought that he may not know about Deeb or the law enforcement officers may not know him, so I told him no I wasn't sure about that, that I had just said that.
- Now, why did you do that? Q.
- Well, at the time I made the tape, I hadn't told the Α. whole story for several reasons, and when he asked me about Deeb I thought that he may not know as much as I thought they might know, and I didn't want to give him any more than I had to; just give him enough to where they would believe that I knew what I was talking about, so I denied that and said that I had just said that.
- You said you didn't want to tell the whole story for Q. several reasons. What were those reasons?
- Well, Spence and I were there in jail. Deeb and my Α. brother were not in jail, and I didn't know if they knew anything about them or not.
- Q. The law enforcement people?
- Α. Yes, sir.

Q. Okay.

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So I was trying to keep my brother out of it, and when Α. he asked me about Deeb, I took it for granted that he may not know very much about it, so I didn't want to say that either. At the time I gave the statement, I had just returned from prison. Before I had left, Spence had been saying a lot of things. I had heard a lot of things that he was saying to people about the lake murders, and that we were involved. When I came back -- I thought he may have been talking to Truman Simons. When I got back to prison I was asked a few times about the triple murders. I never said anything about it. It was publicized that several persons and names given that had been suspects, so I figured it had come from Spence. So when I came back, I thought that Spence may come down and give a statement or confession and try to push it all off on me, so I gave him -that's one of the reasons I gave the statement, because I thought I could hold him off and cut me down and try to put everything on everybody else or me.

- Q. Okay. So did the first statement say anything about Tony?
- A. No, sir.
- Q. All right. When was the first time you realized that you had said something about Deeb in the tape recorded

1 statement? After the law enforcement officer questioned me. 2 Α. Okay. Did you give another statement after you gave Q. 3 4 the tape recorded statement? 5 Α. Yes, I did. 6 What kind of statement was that? Q. Α. That was a written statement. What I did was, there 8 was a copy of the oral statement on the tape was transcribed -- I had been questioned about the 9 statement by law enforcement officer and I had told 10 him that I had just said that about Deeb and a few 11 other things. 12 I told him the statement wasn't correct 13 and that I would like to change a few things in it to correct it because I hadn't said everything in it, 14 so what I did was, I got the transcribed part and 15 16 told the officer it would be easier for me to remember, so I just went page by page and wrote it 17 out in my own handwriting. That's what I did. 18 19 So is that the second statement? Q. Α. Yes, sir. Did it mention anything about either Tony or Deeb? 21 Q.

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- 22 Α. No, sir.
- 23 Okay. For the same reasons you stated a while ago? 0.
- 24 Α. Yes, sir.
- 25 Q. Were there any more statements that you gave?

1 A. No, sir, I think -- I'm not sure. 2 I think the last statement I gave was this one that I just gave to you. 3 Q. Okay. When did you give that one? 4 A. In January of '85. 5 All right. Why did you give that statement, Gilbert? Q. 6 Α. Well --7 Wait a minute. At that time, tell the Jury whether or Q. not you had come to your decision that you told us 8 9 about earlier to tell the truth. 10 Yes, sir. I had been thinking about it and well, one Α. of the last statements that I gave in '83, later I 11 12 retracted that statement. 13 Q. Why did you retract that statement? 14 I retracted that statement because I didn't -- they Α. 15 had asked me a couple of times if Tony was involved 16 in it or not. 17 Q. Who had; the policeman? 18 Α. Yes, sir. 19 Q. Okay. 20 And I was being questioned about the statement, Α. 21 whether it was the whole truth and the whole story was 22 in it, and they started asking me questions about Tony 23 and some other things which I denied, but I sort of felt that the way I had given the statement, I hadn't given a whole lot that maybe could be used against me

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and then they started asking me about Tony and a couple of other things, so I just backed off the statement.

- Q. What do you mean you don't think you hadn't given a lot that could be used against you? What do you mean by that?
- A. Well, when I gave the statement, I gave it because I was afraid Spence may come down and give a statement and say a bunch of things about me and push it off on me, or change things around, so as I was giving the statement, I did that more or less to hold him off and to try to keep my brother out of it and I was trying to see how much maybe the law enforcement officers knew about the case, so I tried to say enough to where they would believe, but try to leave enough open to where it wouldn't be too incriminating because it could -- probably would have been used against me.
- Q. All right. Tell the Jury whether or not you made any attempts to contact Spence to inform him of what your plan was.
- A. Yes, sir, I did.
- Q. How many attempts to contact him?
- 23 | A. One.

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- Q. Okay. What was the nature of that attempt?
- 25 A. I had given Simons the statement, so right after that,

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in the same month, I believe, I wrote a letter to Spence and through one of the Trustees, I got the Trustee to go to the floor where he was out, passing out laundry, and slipped the note to a friend of mine to read it -- or give it to Spence.

- All right. So you slipped him a note? Q.
- Yes, sir, a letter. Α. 7
 - A letter. Okay. What were you trying to convey to Q. Spence in the letter?
 - I was trying to tell Spence what I had said to the law Α. enforcement officers. What I did was -- I told him everything. I said -- and if he wanted to maybe work something out with them, he and I could work out something with them as far as pleading guilty to something, it might leave my brother and whoever else out of it, and Deeb out of it, and maybe we could just take the whole rap for the thing and leave the other two people involved out of it.
 - All right. Did the letter say anything about Deeb? Q.
- 20 Α. Yes, sir it did.
 - Q. What was that?
 - Well, when I wrote the letter, I also wrote it in a way Α. to where it would cover me in case someone, a law enforcement officer, got hold of it. I knew Spence would know what I meant when I wrote the letter and

why I wrote it that way. I was trying to tell him something, but if the letter got picked up by the law enforcement officers and they came back to me with it, I would have a way to explain it. So I said in the letter I was telling him if he didn't want to do what I was saying, or try to plead guilty to it, that I was going to retract the statement also, and if he did, that he may be able to work out a deal to plead guilty, or he could have been — I said that he could use the Arab as part of the deal. I didn't want to make a deal because I didn't think they knew anything about him from what the officer said to me when I changed the statement about what I had said about Deeb.

- Q. Hmmm. Tell the Jury whether or not that plan of yours had anything to do with leaving Deeb out of the second statement.
- A. Would you repeat that question.
- Q. Tell the Jury whether or not that plan of yours about if he couldn't plead guilty, using Deeb, whether that was part of your plan when you left Deeb out of your second statement, the one you gave after your tape recorded one.
- A. Yes, sir. I figured that it may come in handy later if they didn't know about him.
- Q. What was your main concern during this time, Gilbert?

- 1 A. My main concern was Spence coming down and saying something -- nothing had been said really about my 2 3 brother until I had been questioned about it, so I didn't think they knew anything about my brother, and 4 5 when I did that, and Spence did come down, stop him from saying anything about me and my brother 6 7 When I did that if he had got mad he might try to come back and put it on me, and just keep it between me and 8 him. I was trying to keep my brother out of it. 9
 - Q. In the last statement you gave, Mr. Melendez, the one in January of 1985, have you put everything in there that you can remember?
- 13 A. Yes, sir.

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- Q. Okay. Tell the Jury whether or not at times you are -do you have occasions to sometimes still remember
 things about it?
- 17 A. Yes, I do.
- 18 Q. This statement of January, 1985, is it the truth?
- 19 A. Yes, sir.
- 20 | Q. Are you sure about that?
- 21 A. It is the truth the best I can remember it.
 - Q. Okay. During the times you were giving statements and talking with policemen, tell the Jury whether or not anybody ever tried to tell you what to say?
- A. No, sir, no one ever tried to tell me what to say.
